It was constructed in the 19th century, but much of the building was destroyed by a fire in 1933. After World War II, the Reichstag ended up in West Germany and remained deserted for decades until the German reunification. The Reichstag underwent a massive renovation in the 1990s, and this time a glass dome with a glass floor was added to the building. Now, through the glass floor of the dome, visitors can see the main hall of the Parliament inside the building which is under their feet.

M: It's a farm, but there's no soil. It produces vegetables and fruits, but it needs no sun. You can even harvest strawberries and rice in the same place, at the same time! Can you guess what it is? It's an indoor farm. Indoor farms grow plants using water and artificial light. They can grow fruits, vegetables, and flowers. There's one more important product that they can grow. It's fish. The waste water from the fish tank flows through the farm and provides the plants with minerals. In return, the plants purify the water for the fish. Another charm of indoor farms is that they can grow food without using any pesticides or artificial fertilizers. Plus, indoor farms are not affected by weather. It means they can produce food all year round. Of course, they don't need as much land as traditional farms, and many types of buildings like abandoned factories and warehouses can be converted into indoor farms.
