1. 대화를 듣고, 여자가 주문한 트로피를 고르시오.

M: Good afternoon. How can I help you?

W: I'd like to order a trophy for our school's basketball competition.

M: Well, how about this one with a man taking a shot?

W: It's okay, but the pose is very common. Do you have anything else?

M: Sure. What about this one with a ball held by two hands?

W: I like it. It looks simple but symbolic.

M: Every time I was asked a question, my mind went blank, so I couldn't give a proper answer.

M: Okay. I'll see you then.
