1. 대화를 듣고, 여자의 마지막 말에 대한 남자의 응답으로 가장 적절한 것을 고르시오.

W: Excuse me, is Mr. Brown here?

M: I'm afraid he's out for lunch.

W: When do you expect him back?

M: How was your Christmas shopping yesterday?

W: Great. I went to Christina Mall and there were a lot of sales.
